DID YOU KNOW?





Most (80%) private sector employers think employees understand health care costs well, compared to 78% in 2022. However, nearly half (49%) of employees say they do understand versus 54% in 2022.

Employers also continue to have an inflated perception of employees' satisfaction with their overall benefits packages: 78% believe employees are satisfied, while only 59% of private sector employees say they are satisfied.

HEALTH, WELLNESS + THE POWER OF BENEFITS



28% of employees state their personal mental health negatively affected their productivity last year. **Public sector industry: 25%.**



51% of private sector employees say they couldn't pay \$1,000 in out-of-pocket costs. **Public sector industry: 45%.**

79% of employers believe their employees can financially meet their health care obligations. **Public sector industry: 85%.**

75% of employers experienced an increase in benefits costs in the past year. **Public sector industry: 73%.**

62% of employers report benefits claims increased; top selected reasons were rising prescription drug prices, medical care and mental health issues. **Public sector industry: 53%.**

56% of the workforce say it's important to have access to a benefits advisor. **Public sector industry: 51%.**
